DIRECTIONS TO CAMP

Camp is 80 miles south of Wilmington and 150 miles from the Washington metropolitan area.

FROM THE NORTH: Follow Rt. 1 South from Wilmington to the Beach Area. Turn right on Rt. 24 at the McDonald's Restaurant. Go about 3 miles and cross over Eugene Bookhammer Bridge. Turn left at the traffic light on to Camp Arrowhead Road (Rt. 279). Camp is 4 miles on the left.

FROM THE WEST: Cross the Bay Bridge, Follow Rt. 50 to Rt. 404 and continue to Rt. 16 East. Proceed on Rt. 16 to Rt. 1 South. Continue to Camp using the directions FROM THE NORTH as listed above.

FROM THE SOUTH: Take Rt. 113 to Millsboro. Turn right on Rt. 24 East and travel 9 miles. Turn right at the traffic light on to Angola Road (Rt. 277). Proceed to stop sign and turn right onto Camp Arrowhead Road. Camp is approximately 2 miles on the left.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Camp has an infirmary and a health supervisor on duty 24 hours a day. The staff is trained in first aid, emergency procedures, safety and accident prevention and human awareness skills. All campers are required to have written verification from licensed medical personnel that the camper has had a health examination within the past 24 months. Parents or guardians must also provide a current health history of their camper.

CAMPER CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY

In order to provide an atmosphere of Christian community, all campers must adhere to behavior and conduct guidelines which insure that there is no adverse affect to other campers. Full guidelines will accompany the camper registration packet. Any questions concerning these guidelines can be addressed to our registrar.

STAFF

As the foundation of our outstanding program, the staff undergoes thorough screening along with a training program that includes camping skills, first-aid, counseling, Christian education and human awareness. Interest in working with children, dedication to the camp's philosophy and programs, and a mature sense of safety are key factors in the staff selection process.

Counselors are college age and many staffers are former campers who have grown up in the program. International staff hired through Camp America enrich your campers' experience by sharing other cultural perspectives.

Arrowhead offers high school and college youth the opportunity to work with campers in a Christian setting. Staff members come from all walks of life making lifelong friends as they share experiences and work in this unique environment. Camp will gladly work with college programs for credit. PHILOSOPHY

The Arrowhead experience enriches young people's relationships with one another, nature and God. Campers develop their sense of adventure and spiritual awareness as they participate in the activities, outdoor life and community of camp. Youth ministry is inspired by the blend of Christian community and individual spiritual growth experienced in this peaceful natural setting.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Woven into all that we do, and led by professional staff, children attend daily chapel service and participate in expressive "hands on" activities. Each session's final Eucharist is developed and led by the campers and staff. Programs and activities center on our place in God's natural world.

PROGRAM

Arrowhead offers a de-centralized experience for boys and girls, entering grades 2 to 11, attending sessions simultaneously. Each camper is assigned to a "Family" of 10 peers, with a senior counselor and an assistant counselor. Friendships become strong as this group plans activities, eats, worships and plays together as a unit.

LOCATION

Camp is located on Delaware's Rehoboth Bay on a beautiful 167 acre wooded tract.

CAMPING PROGRAMS

"Camp Arrowhead is open to all children, regardless of religion, race or origin, who wish to have a fun filled experience in the loving environment of God's beauty."

TASTE OF CAMP

This program gives children entering 2nd or 3rd grade a three night camping experience. New campers become acquainted with the camp layout and activities. As time passes quickly campers will experience abbreviated camp activities and will end their session with a memorable Camp Arrowhead closing campfire.

HOMESTEAD

The Homestead unit is for children entering grades 3 to 6. Their cabin unit becomes their "home away from home" as they spend the day doing their planned activities. Teamwork and cooperation are stressed in all activities.

PIONEER

The Pioneer unit is for campers entering grades 7, 8 and 9. Your child will be assigned to one of 7 self-contained campsites, sleeping in raised screened platform shelters. Having more independence, this unit cooks at least one meal per day. The rustic setting of Pioneer allows groups to form tight bonds as they lash a table, plan a progressive dinner or go for a sail.

PATHFINDER

The Pathfinder program is co-ed serving those entering grades 10 and 11. Pathfinders participate in camp's customary activities while emphasizing some specific programs. This program is counseled by senior staff who are skilled in working with older campers.

Pathfinders also participate in a community service project while at camp. (Documentation of hours will be provided.) See Program Notes for the Pathfinder programs being offered.

ARROWHEAD DAY CAMP

This program is offered to children entering grades 3 to 6 who wish to experience camp's wonderful activities, but who are not quite ready to sleep over. Campers will be assigned to co-ed groups. Drop off your camper at 7:45 a.m. and return at 6:30 p.m. for a full day of Christian camping and three good meals. Please note that there are both 4 and 5 day sessions which coordinate with our residential camp schedule.

PROGRAM NOTES

Whether choosing a one or two week session, campers have the opportunity to experience all that camp has to offer. During a one week period, activity choices may be limited due to the vast amount of available adventures, but campers are treated to a unit wide social such as a dance, pool party or beach luau. Two week sessions, which have always been the foundation of the camp's philosophy, allow groups the necessary time to form close bonds and truly become a family unit. An important part of this time is the weekend's Sunday Central, when campers and staff work together on Saturday to prepare for a camp-wide activity on Sunday. Centrals are themed and never forgotten by those who experience them! Second session has featured topics such as Dr. Suess, Wild West Days, Alice in Wonderland and Halloween. Camper groups invent games, make costumes and decorate their "area" for a day of lasting memories. Session four is the traditional "Color Clash" in which the camp is divided up into four teams, making costumes, banners, and songs in order to participate in several rounds of planned events. These themes have included Dogpatch Days, Star Wars and Houses of Hogwarts.

ADVENTURE PATHFINDER (SESSIONS 2, 3, 4 AND 5)

Cooking out more challenging meals daily, going on an overnight, and learning knots and how to tie a ridge line set these campers apart. Two Week Adventure Pathfinders also emphasize leadership, greater self awareness and stewardship of the environment. Packing a pocket knife is suggested.

SAILING PATHFINDER (SESSIONS 2 AND 4)

Begin with Sunfish and work up to Hobie Cats. Learn how to rig and skipper your own boat! Take a day trip to swim in the ocean and round out your days with regular camp activities. Good swimming skills are a must!
